Chi Sigma Iota is an international honor society of counseling professionals and professionals-in-training dedicated to excellence in scholarship, research, and clinical practice.

The purpose of Chi Sigma Iota is to promote and recognize exemplary achievement in counselor education and the practice of counseling.

There are over 270 Chapters of Chi Sigma Iota worldwide. Total membership is over 48,800.

Nu Chapter of Chi Sigma Iota was founded at the State University College at Brockport in 1985. It is an active chapter that involves both current students and practitioners who meet on a monthly basis.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Students must have a minimum grade point average of 3.5 and have completed a minimum of 12 semester hours of study in counselor education.

Faculty, alumni, and professional members must have maintained an overall scholastic average of 3.5 or better while enrolled in the program, and must be a nationally Certified Counselor, or hold equivalent state counselor credentialing, or have graduated from a CACREP program. Monthly meetings are held to conduct business, enjoy the fellowship of colleagues and to network. A picnic meeting is held in the summer.
